

Andrew Kier Wise, Ph.D. is Professor of History at Daemen College (Amherst, NY). He teaches courses in World and European History. His publications on the history of Poland and Russia include *Aleksander Lednicki: A Pole Among Russians, A Russian Among Poles. Polish-Russian Reconciliation in the Revolution of 1905* (East European Monographs/Columbia University Press, 2003), *Cultural Identity and Civil Society in Russia and Eastern Europe: Essays in Memory of Charles E. Timberlake*, (co-ed. and intro., Cambridge Scholars Publishing, 2012), and *Feliks Koneczny and Civilizational Fundamentalism in Poland* (Polish Institute of Arts and Sciences in America, forthcoming in 2018). His current projects deal with the immigrant experience in the US, including a monograph on the radical political activism of Buffalo residents Boris and Anna Reinstein (in collaboration with Dr. Penny Messinger), as well as research on the activities of Dr. Francis E. Fronczak of Buffalo during World War I.
